



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Norway (Oslo), Explosion in Downtown Oslo

U.S. Embassy Oslo released the following Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens on July 22, 2011:

This emergency message alerts U.S. citizens that there has been at least one large explosion, possibly two, in downtown Oslo. Media are reporting at least eight injuries and possibly one death. The cause of the explosion is not yet known.

The Embassy advises American citizens to avoid the downtown Oslo area and to stay tuned to local media for information on the situation, including transportation closings, and to remain vigilant and aware of your surroundings at all times.
