



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Bermuda, Inclement Weather Associated with Tropical Storm Maria

U.S. Consulate General Hamilton released the following Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens on September 15:

Due to the inclement weather associated with TS Maria, the U.S. Consulate has allowed staff the option of taking vacation leave today, September 15, 2011. The Consulate will remain open for business with limited staff.

U.S. Citizens affected by the storm should stay indoors and follow the instructions of local authorities. Keep your passport and other valuable documents with you in a waterproof container such as a "zip-loc" plastic bag. Keep a supply of any necessary medications and extra water on hand. U.S. Citizens in Bermuda should monitor the storm through www.weather.bm and the Emergency Measures Organization radio station 100.1.

L.F. Wade International Airport remains open at this time, but most flights in and out of Bermuda have been cancelled. U.S. citizens should monitor local media and contact their airlines for updated information on flight status and airport operations.
