



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Bangladesh (Dhaka), Hartal Scheduled (September 22) Significant Events

U.S. Embassy Dhaka released the following Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens on September 21, 2011:

A country-wide general strike, or hartal, is being called for Thursday, September 22, 2011 from dawn to dusk.

A hartal can involve a total shutdown of the country. Hartals can also turn violent if hartal supporters decide to enforce the shut down, for example by closing businesses or stopping traffic. In major cities, we expect actions to enforce the hartal to center around downtown or commercial districts, though there is the possibility that enforcement actions could spread more broadly. We wish to remind U.S. citizens that even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. U.S. citizens are therefore urged to avoid crowds and any areas of demonstrations if possible, and to exercise routine personal security awareness.

The travel of U.S. Embassy employees and their family members is restricted to the Diplomatic Enclave (Gulshan, Baridhara & Banani north of Kamal Ataturk Avenue) during hartals. The United States Embassy advises its employees to avoid road 86 and 83 in Gulshan, as the BNP Chairperson's Office and Residence are located on these roads. Large unscheduled events occur frequently and usually spill out on to the road making it impassable.

All enrollees are urged to provide complete contact information and a departure date when signing up on-line.
