



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Kazakhstan Violent Demonstrations

The U.S. Embassy has learned of two violent demonstrations in the cities of Zhanaozen and Shepte in the Mangistau Region of Kazakhstan. These demonstrations have resulted in death and injuries. In Zhanaozen, there have been reports of Molotov cocktails being used and looting during the night. In response to these incidents, the Government of Kazakhstan has issued a 20-day State of Emergency in Zhanaozen, which is set to expire on January 5 at 7:00 AM.

We urge U.S. citizens to exercise vigilance and to take measures for their own safety and security at all times. These measures include paying attention to surrounding circumstances and events and avoiding crowds.

Even demonstrations that are meant to be peaceful can become violent and unpredictable. You should avoid them if at all possible. Be alert and aware of your surroundings and pay attention to what the local news media has to say.
