



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Singapore Urges Caution in Light of Recent E

Although apparently directed against Israeli citizens and interests, recent events in India, Georgia, and Thailand highlight the continued need for U.S. citizens in Singapore and those traveling in Southeast Asia to maintain a heightened state of awareness. This includes remaining aware of your surroundings, staying alert to unattended packages/bags in public, and reporting any suspicious behavior to the proper authorities as soon as possible. To reach the Singapore Police Force, dial 999.

These numbers are available from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. (Eastern Time), Monday through Friday (except U.S. federal holidays). We encourage U.S. citizens living or traveling in Singapore to register via the Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) to obtain updated information on travel and security. By registering, U.S. citizens make it easier for the embassy to contact them in case of an emergency.
