



## **Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Tallinn (Estonia), Fifth Anniversary of the Bronze Soldier Riots (April 26)** Significant Events

**The U.S. Embassy informs U.S. citizens of two demonstrations planned for tonight, related to the anniversary of the Bronze Soldier riots in Tallinn.**

The protests are expected to be peaceful, but please remain alert and aware of your surroundings if out and about during the events. We remind U.S. citizens that even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. U.S. citizens are therefore urged to avoid the areas of demonstrations if possible, and to exercise caution if within the vicinity of any demonstrations.

**The planned protests are listed below:**

**Vabaduse Väljak (Freedom Square) - 26 April 2012 from 19:00 – 21:00**

**Sõjaväe Kalmistu in Juhkantali - 26 April 2012 from 21:00 – 22:00**

The U.S. Embassy in Estonia is available to provide emergency assistance to American citizens 24 hours a day. The U.S. Embassy is located approximately 1 km outside of Tallinn's "Old Town" at Kentmanni 20, Tallinn.
