



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Santiago (Chile), General Security Threat

Due to recent terrorist activity worldwide, the U.S. Embassy in Santiago urges U.S. Citizens traveling and residing in Chile to exercise caution and vary their routes and times when traveling to and from work and to pay close attention to their personal security. U.S. citizens should consider avoiding demonstrations, crowds, and other large public gatherings.

U.S. citizens who travel to or reside in Chile are encouraged to enroll in the State Department's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). U.S. citizens without internet access may enroll directly with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate. By enrolling, you make it easier for the U.S. Embassy or Consulate to contact you in case of an emergency.
