



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Mumbai (India), Protest in Azad Maidan Turns Violent

A protest in the Azad Maidan area of South Mumbai has turned violent with reports of vehicles being set on fire. Police have used tear gas and fired shots to try to disperse the crowd. The U.S. Consulate is advising U.S. citizens to avoid that part of the city and to exercise caution if within the vicinity. The Consulate has advised its staff to return to their homes and monitor events through local news media.

U.S. citizens traveling or residing in India are strongly encouraged to maintain a high level of vigilance, remain aware of their surroundings, monitor local news reports, avoid crowded places, and take appropriate steps to bolster their personal security.

U.S. citizens traveling and residing abroad should enroll in the Smart Travelers Enrollment Program (STEP). U.S. citizens without internet access may enroll directly at the U.S.

Embassy or Consulate at their destination. By enrolling, U.S. citizens make it easier for the Embassy or Consulate to contact them in case of emergency.
