EMERGENCY MESSAGE TO U.S. CITIZENS: Demonstrations

**September 12, 2012**

On September 11, 2012, violent demonstrations took place at the U.S. Embassy in Cairo, Egypt and at the U.S. compound in Benghazi, Libya, resulting in damage in both locations and casualties in Benghazi. Media reports indicate that demonstrations may take place at the U.S. Embassy in Tunis on Wednesday, September 12, 2012. Disruptions to traffic and public transport near the U.S. Embassy may result. The U.S. Embassy is currently open for all services on Wednesday, September 12, 2012. If the security situation requires changes to the availability of public services at the Consular Section, updates will be posted on the Embassy website: <http://tunisia.usembassy.gov>.

U.S. citizens should remain cautious and avoid areas where large gatherings may occur.

Even demonstrations or events intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. U.S. citizens in Tunisia are urged to monitor local news reports and to plan their activities accordingly. U.S. citizens should review the current Country Specific Information for Tunisia.

For the latest security information, U.S. citizens living and traveling abroad should regularly monitor the Department's Bureau of Consular Affairs Internet website at <http://travel.state.gov>, where the current Worldwide Caution, Travel Warnings, Travel Alerts and Country Specific Information can be found.

These numbers are available from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday (except U.S. federal holidays).

All U.S. citizens in Tunisia are encouraged to enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). U.S. citizens without internet access may enroll directly at the U.S. Embassy. By enrolling, U.S. citizens make it easier for the Embassy to contact them in case of emergency.
