



## **Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Dakar (Senegal), Possible Demonstrations at U.S. Embassy, September 14, 2012**

This message is to inform U.S. citizens in Senegal that demonstrations may occur the afternoon of Friday, September 14 targeted at the U.S. Embassy. Demonstrations could also occur in other locations around the city. It is unknown at this time if demonstrations may actually take place or when they may start.

Given the uncertainty of exactly when and how large demonstrations may be and the potential for violence, U.S. citizens are urged to exercise caution if traveling in the Dakar area, particularly in the area of the U.S. Embassy, for the rest of the day on Friday, Sept. 14. Stay tuned to media reports, maintain situational awareness, consider alternate travel routes in case of blockage and avoid demonstrations should you come upon them.

If you don't have internet access, you can get current information on safety and security by calling 1-888-407-4747 toll-free in the United States, or for callers from other countries, a regular toll line at 1-202-501-4444. These numbers are available from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday (except U.S. federal holidays).

If you are going to live in or travel to Senegal or Guinea-Bissau, please take the time to tell us about your trip by enrolling in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP - <https://travelregistration.state.gov/ibrs/ui/>). If you enroll, we can keep you up to date with important safety and security announcements. It will also help your friends and family get in touch with you in an emergency. You should remember to keep all of your information in STEP up to date. It is important during enrollment or updating of information to include your current phone number and current email address where you can be reached in case of an emergency.
