



## Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), Possible Demonstrations

The U.S. Embassy in Kuala Lumpur informs U.S. citizens that based on recent events in Cairo and Benghazi, there is the possibility of demonstrations taking place in Kuala Lumpur. At this time, we do not have any specific information regarding any planned demonstrations in Malaysia. In the past, demonstrations have occurred on Friday afternoons, in the vicinity of the U.S. Embassy on Jalan Tun Razak.
