



## Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Vienna (Austria), Demonstrations (September

On Monday, September 17 there will be a demonstration at Muhammad Asad Square in front of the United Nations compound. The group will be protesting the Iranian Vice President's visit to Vienna. The protest is expected to last throughout the day and is expected to be peaceful.

Developing information pertaining to recent protests and attacks at U.S. diplomatic facilities in Libya, is available through many press sources. Although the U.S. Embassy in Vienna does not anticipate the same type of reaction in Austria, the Mission has heightened awareness of its installations and surroundings.

Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. You should avoid the areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if within the vicinity of any demonstrations. Be alert and aware of your surroundings and pay attention to local news media.
