



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Khartoum (Sudan), Demonstrations/Cancellations Town Hall Meeting Riots/Civil Unrest

Due to the possibility of demonstrations at the U.S. Embassy, we advise U.S. citizens to stay away from the Embassy until further notice. The Consular Section of U.S. Embassy Khartoum will be closed to the public on Sunday, September 16. As a result of the on-going threat of demonstrations, we must regrettably postpone the U.S. Citizen Town Hall meeting at the U.S. Embassy that was scheduled for Sunday, September 16, at 6PM. We hope to re-schedule for a date in the near future.

U.S. citizens are reminded to exercise caution at all times and closely monitor local events through reliable local and international news sources. Because even peaceful demonstrations can turn confrontational and become violent, U.S. citizens are advised to avoid all public demonstrations and political rallies as well as areas around them. You should keep a low profile, vary your travel times and routes, exercise care while driving and avoid areas where large crowds are gathering.

If you are going to live in or travel to Sudan, please take the time to tell us about your trip by enrolling in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). If you enroll, we can keep you up to date with important safety and security announcements. It will also help your friends and family get in touch with you in an emergency. You should remember to keep all of your information in STEP up to date. It is important during enrollment or updating of information to include your current phone number and current email address where you can be reached in case of an emergency.
