



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Jerusalem (Israel), Restrictions on Non-Official Travel to West Bank

Due to ongoing demonstrations in several areas of the West Bank, the U.S. Consulate General has cancelled, until further notice, all non-official travel by U.S. Government employees to and through the West Bank on Routes 1, 90, and 443, as well as travel to Jericho and Bethlehem. Non-official travel by U.S. government employees to other areas of the West Bank remains off-limits, as outlined in our current travel warning. U.S. citizens in Jerusalem and the West Bank are advised to avoid demonstrations and large crowds and to remember that even peaceful protests can turn violent with little or no warning. U.S. citizens should exercise extra caution and defer travel to the West Bank to the extent possible. For the latest security information, U.S. citizens traveling abroad should regularly monitor the Department of State's Internet website where the Worldwide Caution, Country Specific Information for Israel, the West Bank and Gaza, Travel Warnings, and Travel Alerts can be found, including the current Travel Warning for Israel, the West Bank and Gaza. U.S. citizens are advised to maintain valid travel documents and enroll with the Department of State or the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem through the State Department Smart Traveler Enrollment Program website, <https://travelregistration.state.gov>.
