



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Belmopan (Belize), University of Belize Student Government Association Demonstration (UPDATE) Riots/Civil Unrest

Belize police have confirmed that the University of Belize (UB) Student Government led a demonstration starting at 09:00am on Monday, January 28, 2013 in Belmopan to protest a decrease in subsidies for new students; approximately 100 demonstrators met at the UB campus and marched to the National Assembly Center without incident. The demonstration may still be going on at this time.

The Embassy would also like to clarify that the march was not led by the President of UB but instead by the President of the UB Student Government.

We remind U.S. citizens that demonstrations take place in Belize from time to time in response to world events or local developments. Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and possibly escalate into violence. U.S. citizens should exercise caution if within the vicinity of any demonstrations. U.S. citizens are urged to stay current with media coverage of local events and be aware of their surroundings at all times.
