



Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Kabul (Afghanistan), Militants Plan to Attack Unspecified Foreign Entities

The U.S. Embassy in Afghanistan received the following information concerning an imminent threat to U.S. citizens living in Afghanistan:

As of early April 2015, militants planned to conduct an imminent attack using a vehicle-borne improvised explosive device (VBIED) against unspecified foreign entities in Kabul City, Afghanistan. There was no further information available on the timing, targets, methods, or perpetrators of any possible attack. The U.S. Embassy is taking this threat seriously and is limiting movements throughout Kabul.

We strongly recommend that U.S. citizens traveling to or residing in Afghanistan enroll in the Department of State's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). STEP enrollment gives you the latest security updates, and makes it easier for the U.S. Embassy to contact you in an emergency. If you don't have Internet access, enroll directly with the U.S. Embassy.

U.S. citizens in Afghanistan should regularly monitor the Travel Advisories on the website of the Embassy of the United States Kabul, Afghanistan, as well as the Department of State's Bureau of Consular Affairs website, where the Worldwide Caution, Country Specific Information and the Travel Warning for Afghanistan are found. In addition, the Embassy encourages U.S. citizens to review "A Traveler's Checklist " which includes valuable security information for those traveling or living in foreign countries.
