The Italian Police have advised the U.S. Embassy in Rome that on Saturday, January 23, 2016 there will be demonstrations in various cities throughout Italy in support of Prime Minister Renzi's civil union proposals which Parliament will begin to debate at the end of January. The demonstrations, which are expected to be peaceful, will occur in the following cities:

**Rome**, Piazza della Rotonda (Patheon) at 3:00p.m. (expected number of demonstrators will be approximately 100)

**Catania**, Piazza Stesicocoro at 6:30p.m.

**Florence**, Piazza della Repubblica at 3:00p.m. (expected number of demonstrators will be approximately 2,000)

**Genova**, Piazza della Meridiana at 3:00p.m.

**La Spezia**, Piazza Garibaldi at 4:00p.m.

**Livorno**, Piazza Attias at 3:00p.m.

**Milan**, Piazza della Scala at 2:30p.m. (expected number of demonstrators will be approximately 1,000)

**Naples**, Piazza Carita' at 4:00p.m. (expected number of demonstrators will be approximately 1,000)

**Padova**, Via VIII Febbraio at 4:00p.m.

**Palermo**, Piazza Verdi at 4:30p.m.

**Siracusa**, Largo XXV Luglio at 9:00p.m.

**Torino**, Piazza Carignano at 3:30p.m.

**Vicenza**, Piazza dei Signori at 4:00p.m.
