



Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Barcelona (Spain), Demonstrations During Mobile World Congress

Consulate General Barcelona informs U.S. citizens that the Mobile World Congress will take place at the Fira Barcelona Gran Via located at Plaça d'Europa beginning Friday, February 19, until Friday, February 26. Daily demonstrations are expected to take place throughout the day. Some demonstrations and protests will affect the immediate area surrounding the Mobile World Congress venue whereas others will disrupt other parts of the city.

This specific event attracts extensive media attention and draws thousands of exhibitors, sponsors, and participants. Different groups throughout the city of Barcelona may take advantage of this opportunity to stage demonstrations, rallies, or parades to advance various causes.

Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. You should avoid areas of demonstrations, and exercise caution if in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations.

Public transportation may experience interrupted service all week due to planned general strikes by transportation employees. The media have already published information regarding these strikes. For more information, please click the link below.
