Due to nearby flooding the U.S. Embassy in Santiago will have limited operations on Monday, April 18, 2016. All visa and American Citizen Services appointments are cancelled and will be rescheduled. For U.S. Citizens with emergency consular needs, please call the Embassy at +56 2 2330 3000. The Embassy will re-open at 8:30 A.M. on Tuesday, April 19, barring unforeseen weather related developments.
