



Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Amman (Jordan), Attack on Jordanian Security Facility in Baqa'a

Following the June 6 attack on a Jordanian security facility in Baqa'a which killed five Jordanian officers, the U.S. Embassy advises all U.S. citizens of the need to practice sound personal security practices. U.S. citizens should remain alert to their surroundings, monitor local media, follow guidance from security officials, and report any suspicious activity to the police. Currently, there have been no changes to the Embassy's security or travel guidance. For further information:
