



## Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Copenhagen (Denmark), Planned Demonstration July 22

The U.S. Embassy in Copenhagen informs U.S. citizens that on Friday, July 22, from 1500 hours to 1800 hours there will be a demonstration across the street from the U.S. Embassy. The Afro Empowerment Center will demonstrate in support of the Black Lives Matter movement in the U.S. We anticipate the size of the demonstration to be approximately 300 people.

Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful may become confrontational and escalate into violence. Police will be present during the demonstration. Please maintain situational awareness and avoid large gatherings whenever possible.
