



Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Belmopan (Belize), Hurricane Earl

Natural Disasters

Western Hemisphere > Belize > Belmopan

Tropical Storm Earl has been upgraded to a hurricane and is expected to make landfall in the early morning hours of August 4. Hurricane conditions are expected within the next 24 hours, meaning winds in excess of 70 mph will affect the country of Belize. Rainfall is estimated to be as high as 12 inches. Storm surge is likely to be 3-5ft. Routine consular services have been cancelled for August 4. Consular activity is focused on providing emergency services to U.S. citizens.

Locate shelter, monitor media reports, and follow all official instructions. Shelters are open to receive people who need them on the Cayes, Belize City, Belize District, Dangriga and Punta Gorda. Belize international airport will closed at Noon today, and will remain closed until after the storm.

Carry your travel documents at all times (e.g., U.S. passport, birth certificate, picture ID's, etc.) or secure them in a safe, waterproof location. Make sure you have adequate supplies (at least 72 hours' worth) of any prescription medications and keep them in a safe, waterproof location. You should also contact friends and family in the United States with updates on your whereabouts.
