



## Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Bangui (Central African Republic), Funeral of FA Officer

Funeral services will be held today for the Central African Armed Forces officer killed last week in PK5. A funeral procession is expected to travel from the Gendarmerie Headquarters at Camp Henry Isamo, located near the Pasteur Institute, to the Fatima neighborhood. The route is expected to follow Avenue Boganda to the Pont Jackson and then into Fatima. The United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission (MINUSCA) is expected to provide extra security along the route; nevertheless, U.S. citizens are advised to avoid these areas.

U.S. citizens who have decided to stay in the Central African Republic (CAR) despite the Travel Warning should regularly review their personal security situation. Embassy Bangui cannot provide consular services to U.S. citizens in CAR at this time. U.S. citizens in need of assistance should contact the U.S. Embassy in Yaoundé, Cameroon.
