



Security Message for U.S. Citizens: Paris (France), Possible Demonstration on November 9

The U.S. Embassy in France informs U.S. citizens that local authorities report the possibility of a demonstration at the U.S. Embassy in Paris (8th arrondissement, Place de la Concorde) on Wednesday, November 9, 2016 at noon in response to the U.S. elections. The Embassy will remain open for scheduled consular services by appointment, as well as emergency services. Even demonstrations intended to be peaceful can turn confrontational and escalate into violence. Avoid areas where demonstrations are taking place and exercise caution when in the vicinity of any large gatherings, protests, or demonstrations. For further information about security in France:
