



Emergency Message for U.S. Citizens: Manila (Philippines), Manila Protests November 30, 2016

The U.S. Embassy in Manila has been informed of a demonstration scheduled to take place tomorrow, Wednesday, November 30, 2016. The demonstrators are expecting to assemble at Plaza Lawton/Liwasang Bonifacio (in the vicinity of Quiapo) at approximately 8:00 AM and march to the U.S. Embassy for a program from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM, then proceed to the People's Power Monument, near Camp Aguinaldo to continue the demonstration expected to last until 5:00 PM. These times are approximations and are likely to change.

Please note that the U.S. Embassy in Manila and the Consular Agency in Cebu will be closed this Wednesday, November 30, 2016, in honor of the Bonifacio Day Holiday.
